Lesson

- 1. Warm up for reading Students read familiar books.
- Introduction of Gas Giant Jump Introduce Gas Giant Jump and start a discussion about fears and/or friendship.

Suggested questions to facilitate introductory conversation:

- Have you ever been afraid of something? Did you overcome that fear? Explain.
- Have you ever helped a friend? Explain.
- Do you like making new friends? Explain.
- Skimming and Scanning Gas Giant Jump Use this time to introduce or review your lesson focus strategies and/or skills.

Suggested skimming and scanning prompts:

- Skim through the book. Do the illustrations help you make predictions about what the book will be about? Explain.
- Look at the illustration on page 7. Does it help you understand how the characters are feeling?
- As you are skimming/scanning, what other questions do you have?
 Make predictions about what will happen.
- Reading Gas Giant Jump Students read independently or with a partner.

 After reading Gas Giant Jump — Open the conversation with a question that relates to the comprehension strategies of predicting and plot. After a brief conversation about the contents of the book move to questions that support your lesson focus.

Suggested after reading content connection questions:

- What is Jones afraid of and how does he overcome his fear?
- Give a summary of the plot using the 5 w's.
- Were the predictions you made while skimming and scanning correct?
- How would you describe Cebal the Magnificent?
- What is the message in this book?

Suggested after reading lesson focus prompts:

- I noticed (student's name) using (reading strategy) while you were reading. Did it help you with your reading? (Repeat this question to highlight different reading strategies or skills used by students.)
- Did you read on for context clues when you were stuck?
- Did the illustrations help you to understand the text?
